As the year draws to a close, we reflect with gratitude on the swift passage of time and the approach of a blessed festive season celebrating our Lord and Saviour. Each year at this time, we share updates on God's faithfulness manifested through our acts of love in action.

Below is a summary of our missions from December 2024 to November 2025:

#### **Washing Machine**

Last December, we purchased a new washing machine for a man living alone who was hospitalised due to illness. In his absence, local church ladies cared for him, including handling his laundry, and discovered his machine was faulty. We promptly provided and installed a replacement in his home prior to his discharge. He later expressed deep appreciation for this gesture.

#### **Wang's Wedding and Children's Ministry**

Our missionary friend in Germany got married in February. We sent a special monetary gift to support her wedding preparations. We continued monthly support for her children's ministry until her passing due to illness in March.

#### **Bethlehem Fire**

As previously reported, a fire damaged a church in South Africa where our missionary friends had ministered before, along with the minister's home. We provided one-time emergency aid to cover essential needs and contribute to church repairs.

#### **Foodbank**

Hana volunteers weekly at the foodbank office in Cambridge. The warehouse and office relocated to a more spacious and serene premises, featuring dedicated rooms including a CEO's office, boardroom, meeting rooms, and kitchen. To fully equip the boardroom, we sourced and supplied four high-quality second-hand conference tables.



### **Ecuadorian Mother and Daughter**

Over the summer, we learned of a homeless mother and her 16-year-old daughter from Ecuador, temporarily housed by a Christian friend. Local church friends offered various forms of assistance. We, at *Nehemiah 9.3 Mission*, also provided Mathematics tutoring for the daughter to support her GCSE preparation.

### **Sri Lankan Family**

As outreach, Hana connected with a Sri Lankan family in summer that had settled in Cambridge over 18 months prior. Facing challenges adapting to the UK and coping with their partial blindness, they required ongoing support. We gladly resolved their needs whenever requested.

### **Shoeboxes**

As posted on our website, we prepared ten shoeboxes this year (five for boys and five for girls aged 10–14), filled with thoughtful items. We delivered them to a drop-off point in Cambridge. We pray that each child will be touched by God's love as they open the boxes.

### **Open Doors**

It remains a profound privilege to support persecuted brothers and sisters worldwide through monthly prayers and financial contributions—a commitment we have upheld for over a decade. This enduring partnership would not be possible without you; we thank God and extend our heartfelt gratitude to you.

In celebration of our 10-year milestone, we have prepared a memorial gift for all of us. We trust it will serve as a cherished reminder of God's faithful work through our shared mission.
